
Apostles, Prophets, Evangelists, Pastors, Teachers, Preachers and Deacons are functions appointed for service in the Assembly; they are not positions within a government hierarchy. There were 12 Apostles whose purpose was to testify about the risen Y'HoShUA, they were required to have witnessed the resurrected Messiah and died for their testimony. Prophets reveal the word of YHWH. Evangelists bring the news of salvation, but have not witnessed the resurrected Messiah. Pastors (or Shepherds) nurture the flock of Y'HoShUA and teachers are to teach the Law. Preachers formally pronounce the word of YHWH and Deacons serve the physical needs of the brethren. The Elder (or Bishop) is the only position which infers authority over the brethren. Elders must be men of temperance and good standing. They are to lead by example not by compulsion.

Teachers (Preachers) – Teach the word of **YHWH** with authority

Elders (Bishops) – Authority over the assembly
